## Article 24 - I have the right to information about staying healthy.

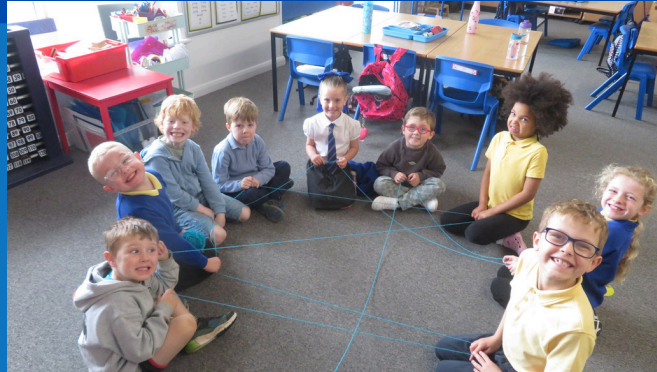
